

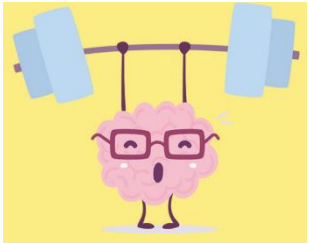

Term 3

Would you like to meet a dinosaur?

These are optional activities but we hope you try 1 or 2 this term.

Move

Can you move like a dinosaur?

Stomp, run, fly... Think about different types of dinosaurs and how they would have moved.

You can take a picture, video or practise your moves to show us in PE at school.

Practise

We have been subitising up to 5 objects in class (recognising that there are 5 without needing to count, e.g. 5 dots on a dice).

Can you play this subitising game? Choose 5 of an object. A grown-up then hides some of them under a tea towel. When the tea towel is removed, you must subitise how many there are.

Observe and explore

Birds evolved from a group of meat-eating dinosaurs called theropods. That's the same group that Tyrannosaurus Rex belonged to, although birds evolved from small theropods, not huge ones like T. rex.

Can you complete this bird spotting activity in your garden? (Please ask for a printed copy.)
