

Mathematics

Year 3 – Place value, adding and subtracting.

Children will be using numbers up to 1,000 to order, partition, estimate, compare and round. After place value pupils will focus on adding and subtracting up to 3-digit numbers.

Year 4 – Place value, Addition and Subtraction

Children will be using numbers up to 10,000 to order, partition, estimate, compare and round. After place value pupils will use a familiar method to add and subtract numbers to 4 digits.

Music

This term, we will be leaning all about Mamma Mia in our Charanga music scheme. We will study and sing a variety of ABBA songs from Mamma Mia, and explore how adding instruments can change the performance of songs.

Art

This term, children will be exploring mono printing. They will be looking into the print works of great artists and, through making links to their History learning, designing and creating monoprints of Mayan codices (Mayan writing).

Computing

This term Leopards will be focusing on computing systems and networks with collaborative learning.

DT

This term Leopards will be focusing on food. They will be adapting an existing biscuit recipe, whilst considering the cost of the ingredients and other expenses

Science

This term year 3/4 will be focusing on grouping and classifying living things. They will group animals depending on if they are vertebrates or invertebrates. They will also classify plants using a classification key. Year 3/4 will then focus on habitats for animals and plants. We will also look at how humans have an impact on habitats.

English

In English this term Leopards will be focusing on narrative story writing using the book 'Star in the Jar' by Sam Hay. We will create a whole class version of the story using plot points. We will focus on different aspects some of which include precise verbs, time adverbials, rhetorical questions and onomatopoeia. For their big write Leopards will then do a continuation of the story we produced where Tom gets lost and his special star friend helps him to get home.

Throughout the term, the children will continue to read with adults regularly, be read to each day from our class books, and enjoy daily 'Reading for Pleasure' time.

P.E.

This term in real PE we will focus footwork skills helping our coordination and also static balance using one leg. Each week Leopards will also be learning some hockey-based team sport skills.

French

In French, the children will focus on learning about animals. They will focus on how to say different animals and ask questions about animals. There will be a lot of role-play, where children practise their verbal skills.

History

This term Leopards will study the Mayan civilization in 900AD, in particular the Mayan economy, culture, religious beliefs and society. Children will learn how the Mayan civilisation has had an impact on modern society and compare what was happening in Britain at the same time.

R.E. & P.S.H.E.

This term in R.E., we will be looking at the question 'Where, how and why do people worship?' focusing specifically on Christianity.

In P.S.H.E., the children will explore the topic of 'Being Me in My World', thinking about being part of a class team, rewards and consequences, and our rights and responsibilities within the class and school community.
