"It's great and now a lot less people are getting hurt!"

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

Chinese New Year 2023

Chinese New Year, or lunar new year, is when people in China celebrate the new year. But in China they run on a different calendar to us using the moon to guide them, so their new year happens after ours. This year it started on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> of January and lasts for 15 days. In this time there is normally a parade and lion and dragon dances. Also, there are fire crackers and fireworks to ward off evil spirits. The colour yellow symbolizes wealth and prosperity and red is thought to symbolizes fire, good fortune, and joy. In China, people believe in the twelve animals of the Chinese zodiac, which were selected through a race. In order to win, the animals had to cross a river and reach the finish line on the shore. The zodiac shows the order the animals finished in and they were all given a year. This year is the year of the rabbit.


Each week 4 children from their class look after the guinea pigs! Ellie and Lily R




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After half term, Bratton Primary School are launching our new drive to be more responsible with our waste.
